# Save the Date: Earth Day 2024


JRBP will be hosting our annual Earth Day cleanup on Monday, April 22, at Lake Springfield. This is a FREE event open to anyone who would like to get out and make a difference in their community. We will have shoreline, lake, and river cleanup opportunities available. Pre-registration is required. Trash bags and gloves will be provided.

Experienced floaters have the option to float a 4.75-mile section of the James River from Creighton Access to the Southwood Access. Shuttling from Southwood to Creighton Access will be provided. Bring your own boat or call and reserve one of ours for free. A limited number of canoes are available on a first come first serve basis, so don't delay. Paddlers may also paddle to remote shorelines of Lake Springfield to pick up trash.

If paddling isn't your thing, grab a trash bag and walk the shorelines of Lake Springfield and the James River. We will have multiple shoreline cleanup opportunities available including the Tailwaters Access and Clay Henshaw Memorial Access, all starting from the Lake Springfield Boathouse.

# Lawn Steward Soil Testing



The benefits of a healthy lawn go beyond curb appeal and the satisfaction of a job well done. A healthy lawn will create the right environment for plants to thrive while holding the soil in place and allowing water to soak in rather than leave your property as stormwater runoff. Healthy soils will require fewer inputs and amendments, saving you time and money while preventing excess nutrients from entering our waterways.

Through the Lawn Steward program, JRBP offers free soil tests and nutrient management plans to homeowners in Springfield, Greene County, and Republic. Staff will meet with homeowners, discuss their lawns care practices and goals, and take a sample of soil. Once the soil is processed by MU Extension, JRBP will review the results and create a personalized 3-year nutrient


management plan for the lawn. The plan will explain the soil test results and give recommendations for what to do each season, including compost or lime application, overseeding, lawn mowing recommendations, and more. Sign up today to receive alerts when spots open up this spring!
